And there was already obviously, in those days, a lot of Western heritage. The 1847 Mormon pioneers, there were still, you know, really direct descendants and people that had known people who actually crossed the plains up to 1869. And there had been these celebrations. But he formalized it and named it Ogden Pioneer Days. And so went out here in the old Lorin Farr Park, where we still are.

It's the West most spectacular outdoor setting. And so here we are now, all these years later, our 91st year. And I was born and raised in Ogden. I've gone to the rodeo my whole life. I've been around livestock and horses and a little bit of that hobby, hobby kind of stuff. But we were. County certainly is a long way away from the rural from rural kind of things.

And so but the other thing I want to say, real quickly, mare, and your other questions, is that Ogden Pioneer Days has grown up to be there are 765, sanctioned professional Rodeo Cowboys Association.

Ogden is number 14. That's because of the money that we pay out and I've talked to people now in the industry and just held in high esteem. And I think people need to understand what we have here, even though even if you don't have never ridden a horse or anything like that, it's just really a fun time.

Do do the concert here with us in the stadium the next night in big Sky, Montana, and then on to Cheyenne Frontier days, boom, boom, boom, boom boom.
